

GUIDE TO FOAL REGISTRATION

APRIL

- Ensure you have received a Foal Registration Form for each mare expected to foal.

ONCE THE FOAL IS BORN

- Ensure you have arranged for your vet to bloodsample and microchip the foal as soon as possible (bloodsampling kits are now supplied directly to the vet along with the microchips).

FOAL RETURNED HOME FROM STUD?

- BEFORE your veterinary surgeon implants a microchip, please ask for the foal to be scanned to check this hasn't already been done.

FOAL TRAVELLING ABROAD?

- Ensure the dam is registered as a broodmare and the foal is bloodsampled and microchipped BEFORE they leave the country.

MAY

- Have you informed us of all non-productive results of your mares?
This can be done at no charge via the Internet at www.weatherbys.co.uk

JUNE

- If your mare is not yet registered as a broodmare you risk paying a higher fee to register her foal.

JULY

- Have you registered your foal yet? For instructions please see your foal registration form. If not you only have a month to take advantage of the lowest fee.

31ST JULY

- Last Chance to Register Your Foal At The Lowest Fee. (Returns received after this date will be subject to the higher fee).

FOAL BORN AFTER 31ST JULY DEADLINE?

- Ensure you send in the Foal Registration Form and fee within 2 weeks of birth to qualify for the lowest fee.

30TH SEPTEMBER

- Last day to register foals at the second fee.

OCTOBER

- Your maiden mare (being covered for the first time) should be a registered Broodmare.

31ST DECEMBER

- Last day to register a foal!
(It costs significantly more to register a yearling).
